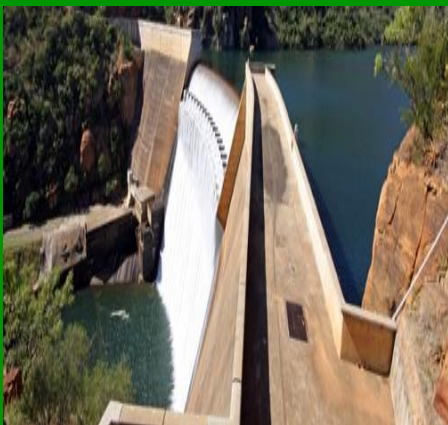

In keeping with ETC's Quality Control Management, she has the overall and primary responsibility for managing ENERGIA's international programmes, coordinating the networks activities, planning, monitoring, reporting and liaising with ENERGIA's donors.

Ms. Oparaocha provides technical support to the network's activities on international policy advocacy, gender audits of energy policies, technical advice to energy projects, women entrepreneurship development, training of trainers and practitioners, research and case study development, network building and knowledge management. Ms Oparaocha is a member of the Advisory Board of the Sustainable Energy for All Initiative.

Mrs. Barsha Shrestha is Deputy CEO of **Clean Energy Development Bank (CEDB) Ltd.** In this role, she manages sustainable banking projects with focus on clean energy and entrepreneurship. Under her leadership as an Acting CEO, CEDB became the first and only Nepalese member bank of Global Alliance for Banking on Values (GABV). Her efforts as a banker and as a social leader have been honored with numerous awards including “Woman Manager Recognition Award - 2010” from the Management Association of Nepal.
